If you want to dispose of the old editions and want to help the environment, then here is your opportunity. All **single-family or duplex** homes within Sunny Isles Beach are eligible to recycle phonebooks by placing them on top of your newspapers in your **GREEN BIN** on any recycling day. Miami-Dade County's curbside recycling program will accept phonebooks through November 30. Condominiums and Apartment Complexes are serviced by private waste management companies and should refer to them for recycling dates and restrictions.
