### A MESSAGE FROM THE Mayor

As we approach the new budget cycle for the 2024-2025 Fiscal Year, I want to take a moment to discuss our budgeting process and emphasize the importance of transparency and resident involvement.

Our fiscal year runs from October 1 to September 30, but planning for the budget begins many months in advance. The process kicks off in May with a City Commission Vision Workshop, where the Commission shares their ideas and priorities for the upcoming fiscal year. The vision of the Commission is driven by you - our residents. All members of the Commission prepare their top priorities for the budget based on what we learn from speaking with and listening to the citizens of Sunny Isles Beach.

Over the next few weeks, each department works diligently to plan their expenses to align with the vision of our Commission and residents. The goal is always to keep costs low without sacrificing the high level of service and quality the City is known for.

Your participation is a vital part of the budget process. This year, we introduced an event interest form to encourage collaboration and gather proposals from residents. This initiative allows you to propose events for consideration during budget development. Remember, events happening now are planned many months in advance. To see your ideas come to life, they must be proposed and budgeted for during the budget season, not at the last minute.

Transparency is a core value of our budgeting process and is crucial for maintaining public trust and government credibility. That's why I encourage you to join us during our budget workshops and meetings. The tentative dates for public hearings are:

- September 3 First Public Hearing
- September 12 Second (Final) Public Hearing where the Budget is adopted, and tax millage rate is set.

Please note that these meetings are tentative pending the county and school board budget hearing dates. Any changes will be updated on our meeting calendar at sibfl.net/events. I also urge you to sign up for email notifications, download our mobile app My Sunny Isles Beach, and follow us on social media to stay informed.

Lastly, I want to acknowledge our Finance Department. They have been awarded the Distinguished Budget Presentation Award for the 15th consecutive year and the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting for the 13th straight year. These recognitions reflect the high standards of transparency and efficiency in our budgeting process.



### Hurricane Season: The Time to Get Ready is Now

According to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), the 2024 hurricane season (June I – November 30) promises above-normal activity in the Atlantic. Not all storms become hurricanes, of course, but strong storms still present their challenges in SIB, particularly with flooding. Therefore, it's important that we all remain alert so that we can make the best decisions for our families.

When a hurricane approaches, the city's Building Department and Code Enforcement will secure city properties, ensuring that equipment and debris do not become dangerous projectiles. Homeowners must take steps to secure their properties. When possible, the city assists by providing sandbags. Condo associations must secure the common areas of buildings and complexes. Check in with your association. It's important to know what you can expect from your HOA. You don't want to make wrong assumptions as your safety may depend on it.

If a hurricane becomes a category 2, Sunny Isles Beach residents will be told to evacuate. Since a storm can quickly increase in intensity, I would not plan to ride out ANY category hurricane in SIB. We can be facing a category 2 or 3 from one day to the next,

leaving you less time to evacuate safely. Please note, it's not about trusting your hurricane windows, but being in a building with no power, no elevators, and NO OPTION to call 911. Emergency services will not come to you in the middle of a hurricane – certainly not when you have been ordered to evacuate.



This is the time to make your plan. If you have friends or family who can take you in for a week, make that plan with them now as hotels may be tougher to book during an evacuation. If you want to pack more lightly, coordinate Amazon deliveries with them -- like inflatable mattresses, etc. Lastly, DO NOT LEAVE YOUR PETS BEHIND. They may end up stuck and dehydrated in hot dark apartments due to loss of power. If you are delayed in your return, they may run out of food and water. Include them in your plan (Amazon purchases included) and take them with you.

### New Parking Rates For Non-Residents: Residents Can Register For Discount

Beginning August 1, parking fees at municipal lots around Sunny Isles Beach will increase by \$2 per hour. Beach parking lots at Ellen Wynne and Pier Park will go from \$3 to \$5 per hour. Other municipal lots, including Gateway Park garage and Heritage Park garage, will increase from \$2 to \$4 per hour.

Sunny Isles Beach residents with a valid City-issued Sunny Isles Beach Resident ID Card can apply for a discounted resident rate. Look for more information coming soon at <a href="mailto:sibfl.net/parking.">sibfl.net/parking.</a>





### INTERSECTION SAFETY CAMERA PROGRAM

The City is introducing the Intersection Safety Camera Program to reduce the number of traffic violations, crashes, and injuries caused by red-light runners. These cameras, placed at various intersections around the City, operate 24 hours a day, 365 days per year. The goal is to change drivers' behavior, ensuring the community's safety as more drivers obey traffic signals and stop on red.

### **Camera Locations:**

- Sunny Isles Blvd. at the 200 Block
- 183 St. and Collins Ave. (north and southbound lanes)
- 193 St. and Collins Ave. (southbound lanes only)
- 159 St. and Collins Ave. (north and southbound lanes)



### **How Red-Light Cameras Work:**

The cameras are activated by sensors that detect vehicle movement at the mentioned intersections when the traffic signal turns red. They are activated when a vehicle runs a red light. Each video recording is then reviewed by the Sunny Isles Beach Police Department before the notice of violation is issued.

### **Fees and Ticket Information:**

The registered owner of the vehicle will receive a \$158 civil violation in the mail. This violation does not add points to the driver's license and will not affect insurance rates.

### **Payment Options:**

Violations must be paid online at secure.redlightviolations.com, by phone at 877-204-0904, or by mail as indicated on the notice.

### **Consequences of Non-Payment:**

If the violation is not paid, a Uniform Traffic Citation is issued, and the case is transferred to the Miami-Dade County Clerk of Court, where the fine is increased to \$277. Failure to pay or successfully contest the citation in County Court may result in suspension of driving privileges.

### If You Were Not the Driver:

You can request a hearing to dispute the violation or submit a sworn and notarized affidavit stating who was driving at the time of the violation. The affidavit is available online at secure.redlightviolations.com.

### **Warning Period:**

The program will start with a warning period from August 1 to August 31. Beginning September 1, violators will be issued a \$158 fine.
